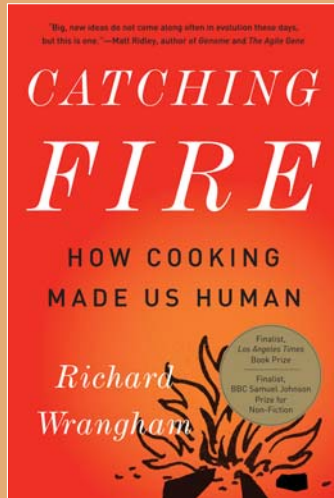


## NEW IN PAPERBACK FROM BASIC BOOKS

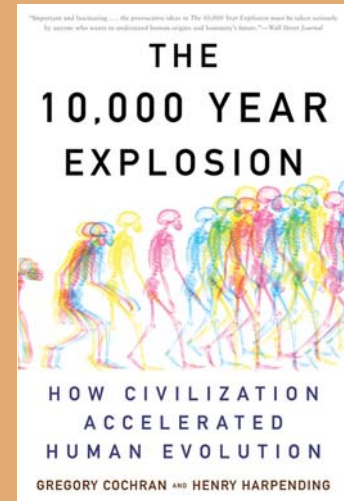
Scientists have long believed that the “great leap forward” that occurred some 40,000 to 50,000 years ago in Europe marked end of significant biological evolution in humans.

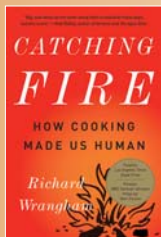

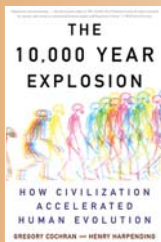
